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### PREFACE

The papers in this volume are an outgrowth of the second "International Symposium on Hamiltonian Systems and Celestial Mechanics" which was held in Cocoyoc, Morelos, México from September 13 to 17, 1994. The proceedings of the first symposium were published in Volume 4 of this series under the title "Hamiltonian Systems and Celestial Mechanics". The Scientific Organizers of the Conference were Ernesto A. Lacomba and Jaume Llibre and the members of the Technical Organizing Committee were Joaquín Delgado, Ernesto Pérez-Chavela, from the Universidad Autónoma Metropolitana, México and Kurt B. Wolf on the part of CIFMA (Centro Internacional de Física y Matemáticas Aplicadas, Cuernavaca, México). Special thanks go to J.
